Children will be concentrating on reading many high quality books throughout the year. # Literacy

This term in Literacy we will use two WW2 texts - 'Kensuke's Kingdom', and 'Otto' to learn about narrative, biography and autobiography writing. We will also practise speech writing and explore some WW1 poetry.

# Science

This term in Science we will be learning about 'All living things' and 'Animals including humans.' Children will have the opportunity to conduct research and investigations to learn about the Human circulatory system and the impact of diet and drugs on the human body.
